SUMMARY OF UPDATES


THE BAHAMAS: NATIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (NEMA)

- Seven (7) confirmed fatalities
- > Twenty five (25) persons evacuated from Great Abaco to New Providence
- > 50 children have been evacuated from a children's home in impacted areas in Grand Bahama
- > 449 persons recorded in 9 shelters in Great Abaco; 346 persons in 17 shelters in Grand Bahama
- Parts of Abaco have been decimated; severe flooding, damages to infrastructure and buildings; southern Abaco suffered less devastation than the north
- > The Mudd in Abaco is completely destroyed.
- > The national airport in Abaco is completely flooded
- > Treasure Key airport runway is still functional, however access via road is limited due to flooding
- > Approximately 60% of homes are damaged in Marsh Harbour
- > Priority is for search and rescue and recovery efforts
- > Bahamas marine is transporting food and medical supplies to Great Abaco
- > RNAT is scheduled to deploy to Grand Bahama and Great Abaco on Wednesday September 4, 2019 after the "All Clear"
- > The U.S. Coastal Service continues to assist in search and rescue efforts
- > Additional members of the Royal Bahamas Police Force will be sent to Great Abaco to facilitate safety
- > Four (4) U.S. helicopters are performing search and rescue operations
- > The UK Royal Navy vessel is expected to deliver food in Abaco to residents tonight Tuesday 3, 2019
- > An "All Clear" is expected to be issued at 04:00 hrs for Great Abaco on Wednesday September 4, 2019

Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA) Actions

- A CARICOM High Level Mission to The Commonwealth of the Bahamas in the aftermath of Hurricane Dorian is planned for Thursday September 5, 2019.
- The Rapid Needs Assessment Teams are expected to start assessments on the family islands most impacted by Dorian by Wednesday September 4, 2019 after the All Clear is issued.
- The Regional Coordination Plan (RCP) remains activated (as of August 30, 2019)
- CDEMA and the UN Resident Coordinator co-chaired the seventh meeting of the Regional Response Mechanism Partners -Caribbean Development Partners Group - Disaster Management (CDPG DM), at 1:00 PM September 3, 2019 at the CDEMA CU in Lower Estate, St. Michael, Barbados.
- The Regional Response Teams remain on ALERT: (CARICOM Disaster Assessment and Coordination (CDAC), CARICOM
 Operational Support Team (COST), Rapid Needs Assessment Team (RNAT), the Multi-National Civil Military Coordination Cell
 (MNCCC), the CARICOM Disaster Relief Unit (CDRU) and the Regional Search and Rescue Team.
- CDEMA CU urges all Participating States and members of the Regional Response Mechanism (RRM) to continue to monitor the progress of this system as it tracks on to the northwestern Caribbean States.
- The CDEMA CU will continue to monitor the track of Hurricane Dorian and provide updates as necessary. For more information

RELIEF SUPPORT

FAO

• Experts on standby to support RNAT assessments in agriculture and livelihood sectors

IFRC

- IFRC Regional Team in Bahamas awaits the all clear on September 4, 2019 to begin assessment
- IFRC launched international appeal of \$3.2 million Swiss Francs to provide support for 20,000 people
- The National Societies in a number of Caribbean States have launched appeals to raise funds for response through the Bahamas Red Cross
- Increased surge capacity on the ground with an additional specialist
- Coordinating with the CDEMA led RNAT on the assessments which will be undertaken

ITU

· To provide emergency telecoms equipment based on needs identified

OFDA

- The first relief flight is expected to arrive in Nassau tonight, September 3, 2019
- To provide RNAT and PDNA support as needed; sexual and gender based health assessments of priority

OCHA

- Deployed 3 staff members in Nassau to support the coordination and information management process
- Provided one information management specialist to support the CDEMA Coordinating Unit

PAHO

- Reported medivac of patients from Great Abaco to the Princess Margaret Hospital in Nassau
- Deployed seven (7) additional personnel to support public health and logistics
- Received offers from medical staff from other Eastern Caribbean countries to aid in first response

UNFPA

• To provide RNAT and PDNA support as needed; sexual and gender based health assessments of priority

UNICEF

• Contribution of a WASH emergency response team as part of United Nations response to the humanitarian situation in the Bahamas

RELIEF SUPPORT

WFP

- · Activated logistical support from Panama regional office
- Confirmed provision of emergency equipment: two (2) logistics hubs and VSATs to Grand Bahama and Great Abaco courtesy of UNHRD. Equipment consists of: mobile storage units, generators, pre-fab offices, and lighting
- · Experts available and on standby for on-call support

UK Government

• The UK Government has made arrangements for the RFA Mounts Bay to provide relief supplies and WASH support to Great Abaco
