The main lines of support will be restoring access to essential health services and medical care capacity; providing safe drinking water; ensuring proper hygiene, sanitation and waste management in affected communities; as well as implementing crucial disease prevention</u>
3.	Government of France	Pledged in the first instance 10 hrs of airlift support to Dominica. Also support for distribution of relief supplies to inaccessible areas.
4.	Government of the United Kingdom	£300,000 provisionally allocated based on needs identified. The RFA Lyme Bay dispatched to to support relief efforts .
5.	Government of the United States of America	Emergency grant of US\$50,000 available to support humanitarian assistance on formal request based on needs identified.
